Good evening -- As part of the expansion of the ponds on the Eden Rise property—which we recently coordinated for acquisition by Powder—we will be adding a fifth pond. This will become our first in line, and largest, pond dedicated to effluent detention.

As you are aware, in order to properly utilize the pond system, we will be pursuing a reuse permit that allows reuse water to be land-applied on adjacent areas of the Eden Rise property. To implement the land application of reuse water, several state-level approvals will be required.

Attached is a Gantt chart prepared by the District's consultants outlining the estimated timeline and coordination required to obtain the necessary Reuse Application Permit(s). Once the final location and size of Pond 5 are finalized, the land on which the ponds are located will be deeded to the District. In addition, we will be granted a long-term agreement with Powder for several hundred additional acres to support the land application of the reuse water. In December, the County provided initial approval for the additional pond.

I met today with Brooke and Roy, and we are aligned on the path outlined above. Over the next few weeks, we will work toward a letter agreement to memorialize these understandings while we finalize the pond's location and size. Once those details are complete, the deed can be recorded and the reuse land lease put in place.
